Dear Fellow Altrusans,

I hope you were as proud to be an Altrusan as I was at the recent Sugar Plum Festival. I even had a lady I didn't know stop me on the street to thank us for the event and to praise Altrusa for what a wonderful job we do! However, it has come up that some members are distressed by the cost of sugar Plum Festival and about seating arrangements when we are required to buy a ticket.

We each need to remember that our Standing Rules #13 (which we all voted on) states that when a fundraising event is held all members will be billed for the price of one ticket. So for Sugar Plum Festival that means a Friday night ticket currently at \$10 and a luncheon ticket currently at \$25. The rules do not state you are guaranteed a seat. That is how it works for our other fundraising events, but sugar Plum is quite different. As a result of everyone's very hard work, we have created a "monster." **Sugar Plum luncheon is a sold-out event every year!** We have also maxed out our capacity for the Rec center. We can not seat any more people due to the size of the facility.

If it is important to you that you be seated for the luncheon or that you purchase a ticket for a friend or relative to be seated, there are two ways to accomplish this:

- 1) Sign up to set and hostess a table—the perk that comes with is job is you decide how many tickets you want to sell yourself, so you can assign seats at your table. Or,
- 2) Be-friend a hostess and get your ticket directly from that hostess for an assigned seat

You must make your decision right after sign-ups and ticket sales begin as we sell out very quickly. We set 45 tables with 390 seats and we have never been able to accomplish this with all Altrusan hostesses. We must rely on non-Altrusan help. So, there is ample opportunity for each of you to set a table if you desire.

It should also be quite apparent that if you are not hosting a table, you are needed to be a part of the kitchen/serving staff. The only exception to this might be for those who are involved with the fashion show. However, four of the hostesses this year were also involved with the fashion show.

I sincerely hope that we can put aside all ruffled feelings and be proud of what **we** have accomplished for our community. After all, that's what it is really all about!
