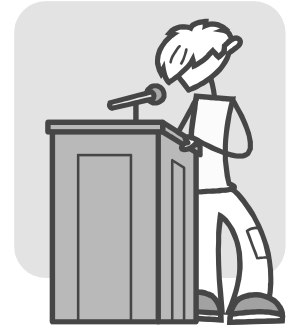

The Collect and Pledge of Allegiance were recited.
Members: 28 Astra: 1 Guests: 0
Minutes of previous meeting were approved.

Treasurer's Report: Willa Sorensen passed the financial report out for June through August, 2006, which was prepared by Jeff Lane, accountant. Service income for that period is \$2874.43. Net income in the service account is \$1726.72. A customary percentage of Deltarado Days income will be moved from the service account to the operating account.

Willa received a credit from the etching company for an overcharge for goblets which will be put into the account. She will pay a bill from Paperworks.

Correspondence: Thank you notes were read: Jo Ann DiBitonto for calls, cards, visits, and flowers during her hospitalization; Kelly Harrison for her scholarship; Lincoln Elementary for the donation to their literacy program. Kelly received a thank you note from House of Promise for the opportunity to speak at a program meeting.

Committee Reports:

Finance: Task Force Chairs reported for the Sugar Plum Festival which is November 17-18. Linda Sorensen is transforming old decorations into new and needs some help.

Willa said that 3000 hor'dourves are needed for the Friday night Artisans Market. For those who do not want to prepare hor'dourves themselves, the hospital has offered to order them. The cost would be \$25 for 100. Each member must let Linda Hattel know if he/she wants to pay the \$25 and order from the hospital or personally prepare the hor'dourves. They must be delivered to Heddles Rec Center by 4:30 PM on Friday.

Warming ovens are available, and there are no outlets at the serving table.

Two types of chocolate fountains will be used. There are sign up sheets going around for food, donations, decorating, serving and clean up. Every member should plan to help with clean up.

Judy Ashby, Book Fair Chair, said that the tag line for the Festival is "Read for Life." Lita is getting book donations from Denver at the International Book Trade Show. A list will be available from which hosts may choose books. Sagebrush Books and Hastings Books in Montrose are participating. Hastings is donating books. Two or three authors are coming and Sagebrush will be getting more. There will be posters to emphasize the Book Fair and bookmarks with information about the various authors and their works.

The music will be DJ style by Gary Cavalier.

There will be three bars.

Doreen and Linda Hattel are taking care of the vendors.

There will be three silent auction items: 1. Eugenia Bone, gourmet cook and writer, will cook and serve a dinner for four at the winner's house; 2. a set of china, flatware, decorations, and table cloth; 3. a decorated Christmas tree.

Another table setting will be raffled off.

Barbara Bullard and Dorothy Dunfelder are discussing the menu.

The tickets for Friday night are \$10 each, and each member is being given five tickets to sell. More are available.

Luncheon tickets for Saturday are \$25 and will be available at our next meeting.

Alice Penick needs four more tables. There will be no complimentary seating.

Guest favors will be the wine glasses.

Table hosts with round tables must provide table cloths. Those wanting to rent table cloths need to let the Finance Committee know before their next meeting on the first Monday of October.

Alowetta Terrien is doing all the printing for tickets, flyers, posters, menus, and programs.

Service: Lita Sweitzer is working on bookmarks which will be printed with "Read for Life," the Altrusa logo and a variety of other information such as the projects Altrusa does, quotes about literacy, and names of participating authors and the books they have written. The bookmarks will be handed out at the book tables and others will be donated to the libraries we serve.

Service hours are in three categories: 1. External: Altrusa projects done for the community such as the Sugar Plum Festival, 2. Internal: activity within the club such as the Four-Club Social, and 3. Other voluntary community service such as tutoring literacy students. Email service hours to Cathy Percefull.

There will be a brief committee meeting following the benediction today.

At 10:30 AM tomorrow books will be delivered to House of Promise. Let Lita know if you want to go.

Some members are taking books to a library at a Katrina disaster site. Talk to Demeris York who is collecting those or bring donated books next week to the meeting.

Lita will travel to Denver to pick up donated books at the International Book Trade Show.

Membership: Nancy Stevens reported that her committee has been asked by Margaret Goodhue, District Governor, to give her nominations for an emeritus award. The qualification is "active, but physically unable to attend meetings." Our club has no one with that status. Yearbooks should be undated by next week.

The application from Marla Hovak for membership will be processed in October.

The committee is working on membership retention and would welcome any ideas for something special that could be done.

There has been an interest expressed for a club in the North Fork area. Members who are interested in helping to start a new club should let René know.

Communications: None

Foundation: Vicki Ripp reported that the annual meeting was held and the Foundation budget was ratified with no changes. A resolution was made to increase the number of Foundation board members from three to five. Janet Burgess and Vivian Gibson are the additional members. It was recommended that the club treasurer be a signer on the Foundation Service Account. Willa and Jo Ann Anderson will set that up at the bank.

Current officers are Vicki Ripp, President; Jo Ann Anderson, Treasurer; and Judy Ashby, Secretary.

Astra: Ethan Twamley reported that the club met on August 28. Mrs. Vincent presented a program on emergency car care and maintenance. They were given goody bags and tips to remember and share with parents.

Barbara asked the club members to serve at the Sugar Plum luncheon. The request will be considered at the next meeting which will be on September 25 at 6 PM at Delta High School.

Astra will host two tables with one being for Astra families.

Accent: Linda Sorensen spoke on the meaning of the "Collect." The word refers to an opening prayer which collects all of the themes into one prayer.

Board Actions and Recommendations: In a previous meeting a motion had been made and tabled for the club to write a letter regarding the paintings in the auditorium of the Performing Arts Center. The Board of Directors felt that the issue should be considered a personal matter, not a club matter. A motion to rescind that motion was made by David Mangum with a second by Nancy Stevens. The motion passed. The Board recommended that each member be given five tickets to sell for the Friday night event of the Sugar Plum Festival.

Unfinished Business: The By Laws/Standing Rules committee is to meet after the business meeting for final review and approval.

New Business: Those who would seek nomination to a district office position, talk with David Mangum, Vicki Ripp, Liz Quintana, Judy Weizbrod, Alice Penick, or Lucky Cox.

Announcements: The Board of Directors will meet with District Governor Margaret Goodhue and Vice-Governor Ida Bender on September 20 at 11 AM at the Elks.

October is Foundations Grant month. Grants provide vocational assistance, scholarships, and financial support to individuals of Altrusa Clubs' community service projects.

Vicki said that \$100 will be donated from the club in October to The International Foundation.
